Main Types of Open Access

- » **Gold OA:** Articles are published in OA journals
- » **Green OA:** Authors self-archive their articles in OA repositories
- » **Hybrid OA:** Articles are published in a subscription-based journal that supports open access

Criteria for Choosing a Reliable Open Access Journal

- » To be listed in the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ)
- » To publish regular issues with an adequate number of papers in each issue
- » To have a well-defined editorial scope
- » To clearly outline its peer review, editorial, and financial policies
- » To provide a publication ethics statement
